About

Tropentag is an annual international conference on food security, natural resource management and rural development.

It is jointly organised by the Universities of Berlin, Bonn, Göttingen, Hohenheim, Kassel-Witzenhausen, Hamburg, ZALF e.V., ETH Zurich (Switzerland), CULS Prague (Czech Republic), BOKU Vienna (Austria) and the Council for Tropical and Subtropical Research (ATSAF e.V) in co-operation with the GIZ Advisory Service on Agricultural Research for Development (BEAF).

Tropentag is a development-oriented and interdisciplinary conference. It addresses issues of resource management, environment, agriculture, forestry, fisheries, food, nutrition and related sciences in the context of rural development, sustainable resource use and poverty alleviation worldwide. The conference brings together scientists, students, graduates, development experts, funding organisations and experts from international partner organisations around the world.

Tropentag 2017 is organised by the University of Bonn, Germany. All students, PhD students, scientists, extension workers, decision makers and politicians interested and engaged in agricultural research and rural development in transition and developing countries are invited to participate and to contribute. We encourage particularly young scientists (PostDocs and PhD students) to present their work.

Conference theme

“Future Agriculture: social-ecological transitions and bio-cultural shifts”

Agricultural systems in developing countries are currently undergoing drastic changes. System-immanent attributes such as visions, aspirations,

cultural specifics and production factor availability shape the response of land users to growing external pressures such as climate change, market demands, land degradation, emerging diseases and policies. In addition to such social-ecological transitions, substantial bio-cultural shifts occur and are imposed by centrally-planned establishments of large-scale intensification corridors and protection zones, or are associated with infrastructure development and urbanisation processes.

The wide array of resulting response pathways and land use or production strategies may include intensification, diversification, and specialisation, but can also lead to abandonment of land, migration and conflicts. What are the implications of such developments and change processes for food security, resource base quality, rural well-being, and in general for the future of agriculture? These questions and related topics will be addressed in plenary presentations and key note lectures in thematic sessions.

Featured: The World Agroforestry Centre

Special emphasis in this year will be given to agroforestry systems with contributions of this year's CGIAR feature partner, the World Agroforestry Centre (ICRAF), through a plenary keynote and invited guest lectures in thematic sessions.

The World Agroforestry Centre (ICRAF) is a CGIAR Consortium Research Centre. ICRAF's headquarters are in Nairobi, Kenya. The Centre's vision is a rural transformation throughout the tropics as smallholder households increase their use of trees in agricultural landscapes to improve their food security, nutrition security, income, health, shelter, social cohesion, energy resources and environmental sustainability.

The World Agroforestry Centre is guided by the broad development challenges pursued by the CGIAR. These include poverty alleviation that entails enhanced food security and health, improved productivity with lower environmental and social costs, and resilience in the face of climate change and other external shocks.

Conference structure

The topic of future agriculture will be introduced by invited international guest speakers and pursued further by key note speeches in parallel thematic sessions. Thematic sessions cover the diversity of research fields connected to food security, natural resource management and rural development and will be addressed by both oral presentations and thematically-related guided poster sessions.

In addition to the plenary talks and the thematic and poster sessions of *Tropentag 2017*, there will be a special pre-conference focus session "Future agriculture and resource management in Central Asia" with invited guests from academia, development and policy. All *Tropentag* participants are cordially invited to participate and to attend. Furthermore, pre-conference workshops will enable participants to improve their skills in related fields. Post-conference excursions will be organised for September 23.

The Apero social evening on September 20 and the informal conference dinner on September 21 will provide opportunities for networking, discussion and exchange among participants.

Submission procedure

The conference language is English. Abstracts of original research on the featured topics containing 250-350 words must be submitted using the online form at www.tropentag.de by **May 15, 2017**. Please ensure that abstracts submitted are meeting a proper level of quality regarding content and language. A panel of referees will decide if an abstract will be accepted, and if yes, as a poster or as an oral presentation. A program committee will allocate the accepted contributions to interdisciplinary sessions. Acceptance of abstracts will be sent by June 15, 2017. Contributors must confirm their participation by June 30, 2017 and pay their conference fee before July 15, 2017. Poster contributions will be grouped into thematic clusters and addressed in guided poster sessions. All presented contributions will be contained in the Book of Abstracts, both in print and online.

Workshops

We encourage you to organise your own workshop! You can either network targeting a specific topic (related to food security, natural resource management and rural development), or you offer capacity building, task forces for projects and follow your own initiative. Workshops can take place mainly in the afternoon of September 19 and morning of September 20, before the conference. You need to describe the objective and topic of the workshop and send your application by **May 15, 2017** to info@tropentag.de. In the case of approval, we help you to find an appropriate venue.
