Title: The African Civet Cat (*Viverra civetta*) and Its Life Supporting Role in the Livelihood of Smallholder Farmers in Ethiopia

- Background: Ethiopia has 90% international export share and a long-lasting history of civet musk farming from civets kept in captivity.
- Objectives: to review prospect and retrospect of captive civet cats farming in Ethiopia.

African civet cat

- ➤ Grouped under order *Carnivora* and family *Viverridae*
- **≻**Nocturnal, solitary
- >Opportunistic omnivorous
- ➤ Age at sexual maturity ~ 1year
- ➤ Gestation length 65 75 days
- >Average lifespan 15-20 years
- >Kits/ litter~1-4 & 2-3 litters/year

Opportunities:

- Natural musk covers 22% of the international demand
- Preferred for high quality perfume production
- Source of export earning, way of life for farmers



Threats:

- demand and price fluctuations
- ✓ considerable mistreatment
- declining of the wild population
- ✓ increasing tendencies towards synthetic fixatives
- ✓ Welfare problem

Recommendation: Extensive studies in wild and captivity and improving the husbandry practices leading towards domestication
