


Introduction

- ITM (Infection and Treatment) Method) is a strategy to mitigate severe cattle loss caused by tick-transmitted *Theileria* parva
- Full potential of ITM not realized due to costs and complexity challenges
- Analyzing vaccine payment strategies reveals farmers' financial tactics and challenges
- Insights from ITM benefits and payment strategies drive the development of policies and programs to enhance agricultural productivity and sustainability
- Understanding farmers' ception of vaccine benefits bridges theory-practice gaps, encourages adoption, and enhances impactful agricultural strategies




- Reduced calf and adult cattle mortally through ITM usage


