## INTRODUCTION


-Cocoa production is being threatened by climate change in Alto Beni

Active participation in the cooperative


Figure 2. Interviewed farmer



# RESULTS

Table 1. Farmers' perceptions on the current climate in Alto Beni.

Farmers' perceptions of the climate in Alto Beni	%
Great irregularity of meteorological patterns	68.6%
Rise of temperatures	65.7%
Extreme temperature drops	62.9%
Absence of monthly rainfall (high uncertainty)	22.9%





## RECOMMENDATIONS

1) Further research and policymaking on emerging adaptations for water-related climate change is imperative:

 Irrigation and shade control management 2) Consideration of other drivers of adoption e.g., learning opportunities, financial support and specialized labour
