### **About**

Tropentag is an international annual conference on research in tropical and subtropical agriculture and rural development. It is jointly organised by the universities of Berlin, Bonn, Goettingen, Hohenheim, Kassel, ZALF e.V. (all Germany), Ghent University (Belgium), Czech University of Life Sciences Prague (Czech Republic), BOKU Vienna (Austria), and the Council for Tropical and Subtropical Research (ATSAF e.V.)

Tropentag is interdisciplinary, science-based and development-oriented. It addresses issues of agriculture, agro-/forestry, fisheries, and overarching topics of natural resources management, environmental and economic sustainability, food security, and nutrition in the context of rural development and poverty alleviation worldwide. The conference brings together students, junior and senior scientists, development practitioners, and experts from international research and funding organisations.

Tropentag 2020 is organised by the Faculty of Tropical AgriSciences at the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague. All MSc and PhD students, scientists, extension workers, decision makers and politicians interested and engaged in agricultural research and rural development are cordially invited to participate and actively contribute. We particularly encourage young scientists (MSc and PhD students and PostDocs) to present their work.

### **Conference theme**

# "Can agroecological farming feed the world? Farmers' and Academia's view"

If current global trends continue, population growth and demands for richer and better-quality diets will require us to roughly double current crop production. However, current production practices threaten our planet through loss of habitat, wildlife extinction and modification of water cycling, just to name a few. Agriculture is among the greatest contributors to global warming, the thirstiest user of water supplies and the major polluter of groundwater.

The debate on global food production challenges has become polarized, among stakeholders, widening the gap between the advocates of industrial agriculture and global commerce, and the supporters of local food systems and organic farming. While the former think it possible to meet the high production demands and ecosystem health through conventional agriculture, the latter rather see the world's small farmers increasing yields by adopting techniques based on natural processes that maintain or improve soil health without synthetic inputs.

We will review recent research results addressing these challenges from various points of view with different approaches. Discussions in plenary and thematic sessions, guided poster tours, and workshops will provide participants with new ideas to enhance our understanding of the potential capacity of agroecology to maintain and restore soil health, conserve biodiversity, and adapt to climate change.

## CGIAR Feature Center-of-the-year

The Africa Rice Center (AfricaRice) will be our CGIAR feature centre. AfricaRice is the leading pan-African rice research organisation committed to improving livelihoods in Africa. It contributes to poverty alleviation and food security in Africa through research, development, and partnership activities aimed at increasing the productivity and profitability of the rice sector in ways that ensure the sustainability of the farming environment and as such fits well with the overarching topic of *Tropentag 2020*.

### **Conference structure**

The theme of *Tropentag 2020* will be introduced by invited international guest speakers and developed further by keynote speeches in parallel thematic sessions. The latter span the diversity of research related to challenges of agroecological farming on a biological, technical, social, economic, and political level, and ways to overcome these. Related aspects will be addressed by oral presentations and guided poster sessions.

The Apéro social evening on September 9 and the conference dinner on September 10 provide opportunities for networking, discussion and exchange among participants. Post-conference excursions to Prague city centre and other surrounding interesting sites will be offered.

## **Submission procedure**

The conference language is English. Abstracts of original research containing 250-350 words must be submitted by May 03, 2020, using the online form at www.tropentag.de. Please ensure that submitted abstracts meet quality standards for content and language. A panel of referees will decide on acceptance of an abstract as a poster or an oral contribution. A programme committee will allocate

accepted contributions to the sessions. Acceptance of abstracts will be send by June 01, 2020. Contributors must confirm their participation by June 15, 2020 and pay their conference fee before July 15, 2020. Poster contributions will be grouped into thematic clusters and addressed in guided poster sessions. All presented contributions will be contained in the online Book of Abstracts.

# Workshops

You may organise your own workshop, specifically tailored to your audience. You may wish to tackle a particular topic, offer capacity building or gather task forces for projects. The only condition is that your topic should be related to tropical agriculture in a wider sense. Workshops can be offered on Tuesday 08.09. (13:00 - 17:00), Wednesday 09.09.
